

Skyline Concert Orchestra

“Anything great *requires* time, patience, perseverance, dedication, and discipline.”

Description of Course Objectives:

Students will primarily focus on aspects of musical performance in a string and full orchestra setting. As a performing ensemble we will study and perform a wide variety of orchestral music.

We will have several concerts throughout the year. ***Participation is mandatory.***

Students will develop a love for music and prepare to be productive and successful members of the community. They will acquire the necessary musical and technical skills that will enable them to actively participate in the Skyline Performing Arts Program and achieve the highest standards of excellence. Additionally, students will learn many non-musical skills such as dedication, discipline, positive attitude, critical thinking, self-esteem, confidence, and respect.

Grading Policy:

Grades will be determined using the following criteria:

Participation: You will receive daily participation points. They will be received through things such as class attendance, practice, and preparation. You *must* have your instruments in class every day. I *will* know if you have been practicing!

Assignments: Various assignments will be given throughout the year. Assignments will include playing tests, scales/exercises pass-offs, concert reports, written tests, etc.

Performances: We will plan to have at least one concert each term. A calendar of events for the entire year has been furnished and is also available on the SHS website. It is strongly recommended to write these dates on your home calendars *immediately*. You are expected to attend every concert and performance – no exceptions. Attendance at concerts and performances cannot be made up and is heavily weighted and will affect your grade substantially.

Grading scale:

Citizenship will be graded according to SHS and Granite District policy as outlined in the “Skyliner” student planner handbook. In reference to class attendance, please realize that in a performing organization it is indeed impossible to “make up” a rehearsal or performance. They only happen once! When it’s over, it’s over! However, *excused* absences will not count against the student’s point total.

Fees:

The Instrumental Music Participation Fee will only be \$30 for the entire year. This includes *all* classes. If student is participating in more than one instrumental music class they will need to pay the fee only once. This money helps our program survive! We use it to purchase music, equipment, bus transportation, etc. **The fee is due during the first week of the school year.**

If a student will be playing a school owned instrument (percussion excepted) the district requires a \$60 rental charge for the year to supplement the cost of maintenance and repair. Please see Mr. Larson to obtain the proper paperwork. **This fee is also due the first week of the school year.**

Uniforms:

The required dress for a formal concert occasion is “concert black.”

Ladies will wear matching black dress outfits with black dress shoes. The uniform will cost about \$70.

Gentlemen will wear black tuxedos with black bowties, a black cummerbund or vest, black *dress shoes*, and black dress socks. Tuxes will cost \$110 (or \$130 if you want the shoes as well).

Professionals from “*Tuxedos by Lee*” and “*Concert Black Clothing*” will be in class to take measurements during the second week of school (Sept. 1st & 2nd). Please make sure you are in class these days so that we can get you fitted properly.

Your uniform must be paid for before you can have it. Please pay by the 2nd week of school.

Expectations:

Again, please remember that the Orchestra is a performance organization by its very nature.

Public performances, **which may and will be outside of school time**, are *expected* of all students and will be considered a major part of your grade! These performances include all concerts, region and state festivals, assemblies, and other special occasions. All students are expected to follow the rules, practice, participate, and **have fun!**

Additionally, you can expect me to be organized, communicate effectively, provide an accurate calendar of events, be understanding, grade fairly, be consistent in what I do and say, and not make any unnecessary last-minute changes!
